The National Association of Federal Retirees is the largest advocacy organization representing active and retired members of the federal public service, Canadian Armed Forces, RCMP and retired federally appointed judges, as well as their partners and survivors.

The Association has been involved in several successful advocacy initiatives over the last 60 years, including: increased pensions of retired civil servants and their dependents, full indexing of pensions, pension income spitting, survivor pension option for retirees who marry after retirement and an increase in the Public Service and Canadian Forces Supplementary Death Benefit. As the pensioner representative of the Public Service Health Care Plan Partners Committee, the Association also puts forward a joint recommendation to the Treasury Board on updates to the PSHCP.

As the Association moves into 2023, our advocacy work continues to focus on our four priorities: retirement income security, a national seniors strategy, veteran well-being and pharmacare. The Association works at the federal and provincial levels, with volunteers and members across the country getting involved for an even greater impact.

Advocating for improved retirement for all Canadians is fundamental to our mission. The Association advocates for governments at all levels to work together to reform older adult care and implement national standards for long-term and home care. This is part of a comprehensive national seniors strategy that includes contacting members of Parliament, demanding that governments address the problems in long-term and home care once and for all, ensuring equitable and quality care for all Canadians.
